An Introduction to the Alexander Hotel

Before there was an Alexander Hotel in Reidsville, there was the Capt'n Sharpe Hotel, later known as the Williams Hotel. There was an even older tavern and inn owned by John Brazell. The Alexander Hotel occupies the site of the Brazell establishment, and the Alexander might be considered the offspring of the Sharpe/Williams Hotel. The Capt'n Sharpe Hotel was built by William M. Sharpe on two acres of land purchased in 1858. William Sharpe was killed while fighting for the independence of the Confederate States, and his widow, Emily, later married Thomas J. Williams and the hotel became known as the Williams Hotel. Williams, too, was a Confederate hero, having received a battle wound from which he suffered the rest of his life. Both Sharpe and Williams were very active in the public affairs of Reidsville.

The Sharpe or Williams Hotel was a popular gathering place for lawyers during court week in the spring and fall of each year. It was a two and one-half story building that stood on or very near the site where the Tos Theater showed its first motion picture in 1937. The hotel began to show its age with the advent of newer hotels in Reidsville (besides the Alexander Hotel, there were the Rogers Hotel in the 1890s and the Nelson Hotel ca. 1908) and eventually became a boarding house. It was razed in 1920 to provide the timber from which L. R. Rhoden, owner/editor of *The Tattnell Journal*, built a craftsman house where the hotel's stable had stood. The Rhoden house can still be seen at 110 South Main Street.

Emma Sharpe, the daughter of William and Emily Sharpe, grew up in her parents' hotel. In 1886, Emma was married to Dr. Orlando Lowery Alexander. In 1890, Dr. Alexander and F. M. Alexander purchased two and one-half acres adjacent to the courthouse square from James O. Easterling, and on 22 February 1892 F. M. Alexander sold his interest in the property to Dr. Alexander. It was on this land that Emma and O. L. Alexander built their hotel ca. 1892.

Dr. Alexander conducted his medical practice in one of the downstairs rooms, and Mrs. Alexander put her knowledge of the hotel business to work. The running of the hotel seems to have been her responsibility. With Emma Alexander at its helm, the new enterprise was truly the offspring of the old Williams Hotel, where Mrs. Alexander had learned the business over the course of her childhood and teen years.

The family's living quarters were on the first floor of the two-story building. They had a son, Waldo, and a daughter, Willie Bird. Waldo graduated from Johns Hopkins University and became a doctor. Soon after his graduation, he dropped dead at age 23 in front of his parents' hotel. Willie married David Lester Stanfield, a lawyer who was elected judge of the City Court of Reidsville (now State Court of Tattnell County). The Stanfields had two children who survived infancy, Mary Helen (1922-2009) and Alex (1930-1999).

The architectural style of the Alexander Hotel is Victorian Eastlake. The name of the architect is unknown. It was built by D. J. Nobles of Statesboro, who also built in the 1890s two fine houses in Hagan: the George Wesley DeLoach house, which still stands, and the D. M. Bradley house, which has been demolished. The large north wing of the Alexander house was added between 22 October 1914 when a photograph of the original house was published in *The Tattnell Journal*, and 22 April 1922 when Mary Helen Stanfield was born in the north wing. The new wing is not of the same architectural style as the original house. Its plain, clean appearance reflects the early twentieth century architecture that developed in the years between World War I and World War II. It is devoid of the millwork (or "gingerbread") that adorns the original house.

Dr. Alexander died in 1920. Ten years later, Mrs. Alexander conveyed the property to her daughter, Mrs. Stanfield, for the nominal sum of \$5.00. Mrs. Alexander died in 1940. The Stanfields continued the operation of the hotel until his death in 1959, but Mrs. Stanfield spent most of her remaining years in Decatur, where her two children lived. She survived her husband by thirty years, dying at age 96 in 1989.

Mrs. Stanfield made a gift of the hotel and its surrounding acreage to her children, Mary Helen Stanfield White and Alex Stanfield, who decided to donate the hotel and its surrounding acreage to a preservation organization that would restore and maintain it. The Tattnell County Historic Preservation Society was formed and the deed

was executed. Funds were raised from dues paid by members to the society and by the donation of money by interested people, some of the donations being very substantial. Many people in Tattnall County contributed their efforts to restoring the building. The hotel was painted, repairs were made, and it became a venue for social functions. It was placed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1982.

The Hotel Register and What It Tells Us

At first glance, there is little of historical interest to be gleaned from a long list of signatures - many of which are either illegible or almost illegible - and the hometowns of the signatories. The heyday of the Alexander Hotel was in a different era than that in which we live today. It was a much more simple time, but there are a few similarities between today and yesterday.

The register shows that many of the travelers who stopped overnight at the Alexander Hotel were on their way either to Florida to spend the winter or returning from Florida to spend the summer in a less sweltering climate than the sunshine state had to offer. This pattern still exists, but now the Interstate highways have replaced the unpaved but hard-surfaced roads that traversed Georgia in the early years of the twentieth century. The Interstates have spawned motels that seem palatial compared with the small country inns of the late nineteenth century and the early years of the twentieth. To some extent, the small hostelrys exist today in the form of charming bed-and-breakfast establishments found both in cities and small towns. The bed-and-breakfasts appeal to travelers who take the back roads through the countryside to escape the monotony of the Interstates and the sameness of the chain-operated motels.

In this post-Depression, post-World War II, post-Cold War age, the small bed-and-breakfast inns and the surface roads that link the small towns are a luxury rather than the necessity they were in the last decade of the nineteenth and the early days of the twentieth century. Typically, the people who indulge in the luxury of the bed-and-breakfasts and the country roads have more time and more money at their disposal than their fellow tourists.

On the first page of the register that begins on March 3, 1913, of the nineteen patrons who signed, only two were from out of state, one from Virginia and the other from Louisiana. One must use his imagination to think why someone was there from Louisiana since most of the traffic was north-south. The other visitors were from Georgia, ranging from Rome on the north to Savannah on the south and including several people from the Tattnall County towns of Hagan, Daisy and Glennville.

Probably, many of those who, throughout the register, were from Georgia towns were traveling salesmen (who were called drummers in the early days of the register) and people attending court. The lawyers from out of town, the judges, jurors, witnesses, plaintiffs and defendants, had to have a place to spend the night. There were also people who had nothing better to do than to attend court for the entertainment it afforded.

It is remarkable that so many people made the trip from Florida to New York and the New England states by automobile on unpaved roads, which were especially hazardous in wet weather, and in cars that tended to break down and to have flat tires much more frequently than the cars of today. Moreover, those long distances doomed the cars to an early death. Maybe those who drove the cars were the more daring travelers who enjoyed an adventure. Passenger rail service was very good during those years and was both faster and safer than travel by automobile. The Alexander guests included many men traveling alone, but often they had their wives and children with them. One family arrived with a chauffeur and one man came on horseback.

The tourist route through Reidsville was called the Woodpecker Route in the 1920s. It was originally referred to as the Augusta-Florida Air Line Highway and ran from Augusta through Metter, Cobbtown, Reidsville and Baxley before proceeding into Florida. In 1921, the towns on the route were asked to raise \$100 each to advertise the route, and two years later the State Highway Commission awarded \$17,000 of federal funds to Tattnall County to standardise that portion of the route between the Candler County line and Reidsville. The county was expected to raise an additional \$17,000 as its part of the cost of the project. Tattnall's population in 1920 was 14,502 and

Reidsville's was 553. In 1921, \$17,000 was not a small amount of money for a county of that size to donate to the cause of tourism.

A Few Observations

The Brewton-Parker Visitors

On October 25, 1925, a group of twenty-one students and faculty members from Brewton-Parker Institute in Mt. Vernon-Ailey registered at the hotel. The register does not, of course, disclose why this group was in Reidsville. An educated guess is that they were a choir or glee club whose purpose was to give a concert or recital at Reidsville High School or at the Reidsville Baptist Church. At least two of the group were known to play musical instruments. Mrs. A. M. Gates (nee, Annette Rycroft), wife of Dr. Albert M. Gates, the president of Brewton-Parker, was one of the registrants. Mrs. Gates herself was a former faculty member. Dr. Gates later became president of Georgia Teachers College (now Georgia Southern University).

A Children's Party

Somewhat of a mystery presented by the register is: Why were those local young people signing the register on March 22, 1929? At first glance, it was thought that Helen Stanfield was having a birthday party. But Helen, at age seven, was younger than the others in the group.

The oldest there was thirteen-year-old Virginia Sumerford. Besides, Helen's good friends Rosalyn Beasley, Frances Folsom, and Virginia Eason, were not there.

Possibly, those seven-year-olds to thirteen-year-olds were there for someone else's birthday party, a Sunday school class party, or a school function. They probably thought it sophisticated to sign the registry just as their parents might have.

This writer recognizes some of the names of the party-goers and a little bit about them.

Lillian Eason became a school teacher and was a dedicated participant in Tattnall County history projects, including the restoration of the Alexander Hotel.

Margaret Alexander was teaching third grade in Reidsville during the school year 1942-1943 but resigned to join the WAVES. After the war, she was killed in an automobile accident in Florida.

Virginia Sumerford survived an automobile wreck when the Sumerford family car plunged into the Flint River. Her mother and Virginia's two-year-old brother were killed in the accident and Virginia, her father and her brother, Taylor, were injured.

Apparently, Daniel Sumerford, Virginia's brother, was not on the trip when his mother and baby brother were killed. The death of his mother made him the darling of sympathetic ladies in Reidsville, who pampered him. They were alarmed one day when he was spotted walking around the outside of the uppermost reaches of the courthouse steeple. He became a pharmacist and served in the Navy during World War II.

Essie and Sammy Friedman were the children of parents who escaped persecution in Russia and lived in New York before moving to Reidsville to open a dry goods store. Their children were very popular in Reidsville. During the time they lived in Reidsville, they were the only Jews in town. Essie, forgetting the difference between her faith and that of her friends, marched down the aisle of the Reidsville Methodist Church one Sunday with the intention of joining. Her parents strenuously objected and Essie's Methodist membership was quickly terminated.

Robert E. Odum served in the Navy during World War II.

Helen Stanfield, was only seven years old when this party (if that's what it was) was held. She married Wylie Kennon White and spent her married life in Decatur. Her work for the Centers for Disease Control was her career. The people of Reidsville and Tattnall County are indebted to her and to her younger brother, Alex Stanfield, for donating the Alexander Hotel to the Tattnall County Historic Preservation Society.

Edith Folsom was the daughter of James and Eva Kennedy Folsom. She married Ted Beach. Edith's grandfather was George Folsom, owner/editor of *The Tattnall Journal*.

It was interesting to hear Eudine Kennedy talk about Reidsville and its residents in the years of her youth. When the school house burned in the late 1920s, she attended school in the Masonic lodge. She played tennis on the clay court on the grounds of the Smith-Brewton house and she danced on the porch of the Rufus Rogers house to music provided by a band made up of Reidsville boys, including Hugh Beasley and his first cousin Tom Reed Beasley. She outlived two husbands, Billy McCall, by whom she had two children, and Bob Winge.

During World War II, Melita Sikes corresponded with a serviceman from the North named Frank J. "Mickey" McFadden of New Jersey. They were married and lived in Reidsville in their retirement years.

Upon the retirement of his father as editor/owner of *The Tattnall Journal* in 1941, Russell Rhoden succeeded him in that dual role. He had begun working for the *Journal* at the age of fourteen and continued his newspaper work until his death in 1999.

George Merriman presents somewhat of an enigma. There was a George I. Merriman who was co-builder of the 1857 Greek Revival courthouse in Reidsville. George I. had two sons named George Merriman: George E. by his first marriage and George W. by the second. The George Merriman who attended the party in 1929 must have been George I. Merriman's grandson.

Barney Jordan was the son of Rev. Barney Jordan, a Methodist minister, and Mrs. Callie H. Jordan, Tattnall County home demonstration agent. After college, Barney, Jr., moved to Augusta where, later in life, he became president of a bank.

The days of the Alexander Hotel and others of its kind are gone forever. For many years they lived in the memories of the people who stayed in them, but now most of those people are no longer among the living. The hotels were remembered for the excellent food served in their dining rooms and for the camaraderie with both the owners and the other hotel guests. Some, like the Alexander, still stand to remind us of an earlier period in our history and to invite us to appreciate and to preserve their vintage architecture.
